Future Bird Of Tellico Village Episodes

Having produced 10 episodes covering 60 species it is time to gear up for a few more episodes. There are currently an additional 22 species in the Tellico Village Bird Checklist that are not marked as “uncommon” and therefore would be perfect candidates for future episodes. In the next few weeks I will work with Cornell Labs to obtain the necessary images and sound clips. After they are obtained the script for episode 11 will be written and we will be on our way to producing four more episodes. Here is a list of the 22 remaining species:
